Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 7:06 PM.

1 Approval of Agenda

The agenda was approved following the addition of: Strategic Plan update, Nordiq Canada update (Fee Increase, Nordiq Canada Strategic Plan), and Social Media and Events.

2 Approval of Minutes (December 13, 2022)

3 Arctic Winter Games & Canada Winter Games

i) AWG & CWG

Race suits and warm-up suits have been ordered and should arrive in time for the Games. Parents have been invoiced for clothing if necessary and some parents have also been reminded of the registration fee deadline this Friday, January 13.

Wax has been ordered. The only outstanding budget item is a car rental for the coaches to share and potentially ordering additional merch for CWG athletes.

Travel information has been shared by Sport North and regular meetings are occurring between Sport North, coaching teams, and mission staff for both games. Communication from Sport North regarding both Games and outstanding items is being forwarded on to coaches and parents as applicable.

AWG will also be held in 2024 so policy review will be needed again soon.

5 Nordiq Canada Equity Funding

Dates are confirmed for the following venues:

Fort Good Hope: week of March 13

Whati: week of March 27

Fort Providence: week of April 2 Ulukhaktok: week of April 24

Fort Resolution is tentatively planned for week of March 19 but is to be confirmed.

Spirit North has drafted a budget that is approximately \$10,000 under budget, which allows for flexibility and unexpected costs. Ollie is meeting with Spirit North later this week to review the budget.

Spirit North coaches that will be leading the ski festivals include: Leah Reid, Luke Finney, Mike Baker and Taylor Bell

6 Strategic Plan update

Administrators have a meeting with a consultant on Wednesday, January 11 to discuss next steps in strategic planning for the next five years. CCNWT can get approximately \$4000 from MACA for strategic planning. A Yellowknife-based firm called Lead Dog will be leading the processes. After Lead Dog meets with administrators, administrators suggest an initial meeting with Lead Dog and the executive before setting up a meeting with all clubs.

David brought up strategic planning and succession planning/long-term planning at the club level and asked clubs for their thoughts in a roundtable discussion. Fort Smith doesn't feel like there is a lot of energy for long-term planning. Yellowknife said their strategic plan is on their website and other clubs may want to take a look at it. Inuvik asked for time to consider.

Ollie noted the consultant may be able to help with succession planning as well as strategic planning. David noted a strategic plan should help with what clubs want to do, not take up more time.

7 Nordig Canada update

i) Fee Increase

Nordiq Canada currently charges \$10 per member. They are considering increasing this fee to \$12 and there is a vote on this next week. The increase is proposed due to rising costs and the increase is likely to pass the vote.

ii) Nordiq Canada Strategic Plan

Nordiq Canada recently released its strategic plan and it's available online. There is a focus on higher performance athletes which may not resonate with NWT clubs.

ACTION ITEM: **Administrators** to forward new strategic plan to clubs.

8 Social Media and Events

Hay River has confirmed it will be hosting territorials.

ACTION ITEM: **Clubs** to forward photos and reports from CCNWT-funded events to CCNWT to share.
